AMIDST A PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION

During the month leading up to the presidential election in the United States, let's unite together on our knees daily before
God as we meditate on and pray according to His Word in these specific ways:

OCTOBER



Meditate on
Psalm 22:28. Praise
God as the King who
rules our nation and all
nations, and ask God to
open the eyes of people
across our country to
who He is and to the
hope that only He
can give.

OCTOBER



Meditate on Genesis 1:26–28. Pray for political candidates, parties, discussions, and debates to honor and treat all people with dignity as image bearers of God.

OCTOBER



Meditate on Psalm 8:5–8. Pray that we would use the authority and opportunities God has given us as citizens in our country to reflect His good and wise rule in the world around us.

OCTOBER



Meditate on Romans 13:1–7. Pray for a president and other political leaders who will promote good and protect against evil.

OCTOBER



Meditate on Galatians 1:6–10. Pray that gospel truth, not political opinions, would reign supremely clear in the church.

OCTOBER



Meditate on Acts 1:8. Pray that God would help you to proclaim the gospel of Jesus during these days to people who are lost—far more than you speak about politics and/or the election.

Meditate on John 17:20–23. Pray that love for, trust in, and devotion to Jesus would unify the church amidst a politically divisive time.

Matthew 22:37–40.
Pray for supreme love
for God and selfless love
for others to drive how
you steward your vote
and interact in political
discussions
and/or decisions.

OCTOBER



Meditate on James 1:5–8. Pray for wisdom as you apply God's Word to how you will steward your vote.

Meditate on
Colossians 3:1–17.
Pray for all that you see
in these verses to be
true in your life and in
your relationships with
others during these days.
Repent of any ways these
verses have not been true
in your life.

OCTOBER



Meditate on Exodus 18:18–23. Pray for leaders in our country who fear God, are trustworthy, do not seek selfish gain, and promote peace.

OCTOBER



Meditate on
Deuteronomy 17:14–20.
Pray for leaders to
hear and obey God's
Word, to avoid greed,
adultery, and idolatry,
to fear and submit to
God's authority, and to
demonstrate humility
before God and those
they lead.

OCTOBER



Meditate on Joshua 24:14–15. Pray that God would save us from idols in our country in order to serve and worship Him alone. Repent of idolatry in your own heart and life.

Meditate on
Judges 17:6 and 21:25.
Pray that God would
help us to live and govern
in our country according
to what is right in His
eyes, not our eyes. Repent
of ways you are thinking,
desiring, or living
according to what is right
in your eyes.

OCTOBER



Meditate on 1 Kings 3:5–14. Pray for wisdom in political leaders, and for humility in them to seek God for the wisdom they need.

Proverbs 21:1. Praise
God for His sovereignty
over leaders in our
country, and pray that
He would turn their
hearts and lives for the
good of many and the
glory of His name.



Meditate on Psalm 72:1–7. Pray for just leaders who "defend the cause of the poor, give deliverance to the children of the needy, and crush oppressors."



Meditate on
Psalm 82:1–8. Pray for
God's kingdom to come
and God's justice to
reign on the earth, and
for us to be a reflection
of His justice and mercy
until Jesus returns.



Meditate on Proverbs 2:9–15. Pray for wise leaders who fear God and discern carefully between good and evil, righteousness and wickedness, and honesty and dishonesty.

Meditate on Jeremiah 29:7. Pray for God's grace on our nation for the good of our nation.

Meditate on Romans 1:18–32. Pray that God would mercifully save us from ourselves and all of our tendencies toward sin individually and as a nation. Repent of specific sin in your life. **OCTOBER**

our government leaders)
while ultimately
glorifying Him.

Philippians 3:20–21 and
1 Peter 2:11–12. Pray
that we would ultimately
live as foreigners in
this country whose
citizenship is in heaven
and whose priorities are
focused on the world
to come.

Meditate on Ephesians 4:1–6. Pray for unity in the church around Jesus and His Word amidst the toxic political climate in our country. **OCTOBER**



Meditate on 1 Peter 2:13–17. Pray that we will live as submissive citizens of our government with ultimate submission to God.

Matthew 28:18–20.
Pray that we would be
more concerned about
the spread of the gospel
in all nations than even
the good of our nation.
Pray for different
nations of the
world accordingly.

Meditate on Romans 15:1–7. Pray for harmony in the church amidst different political convictions, opinions, and perspectives among Christian brothers and sisters. **OCTOBER**



Meditate on
Matthew 5:14–16. Pray
that the church would
be salt and light in our
country that points to
the goodness of God
and resounds to the
glory of God.

NOVEMBER



Meditate on Micah 6:8. Pray that God would help us as the church and as a country to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with Him. **NOVEMBER**



Meditate on Romans 14:23. As you prepare to cast your ballot, pray that God would help you to do so with faith in Him based upon His Word.

NOVEMBER

Matthew 6:9–10 and
Revelation 22:20–21.
As you cast your
ballot, pray for Jesus to
return soon to usher
in His kingdom of
perfect justice and
righteousness in all
the earth.

On the day after the election, meditate on 1 Timothy 2:1–6. Pray for the president, and pray that God will help you—and all of us—to appropriately honor our government leaders, to continually pray for them, to work charitably with them for the good of others according to God's Word, and to live ultimately for the spread of God's love in the gospel throughout our nation and to all nations.
