Congregational Booklets will be available for members on Sunday, September 25, at all of our locations.

At the same time, there is also a critical need for face-to-face interaction and ENGAGEMENT, and we're excited to add a new style of Elder Forums that we will host at our church locations for members of our church family to dialogue with church leaders. During our Congregational Meeting, we will share how you can be a part of one of these Elder Forums, if you would like.

I'm excited to move forward with this increase in both access and engagement as we make every effort to edify one another and shepherd well in the Body of Christ.
