PSALM 23:1-6 CHURCH GROUP SERMON DISCUSSION GUIDE - JANUARY 26, 2025

SCRIPTURE READING

Psalm 23:1-6

1 The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. 2 He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. 3 He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. 4 Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. 5 You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. 6 Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Observation: What does the passage say?

- 1. Read the Psalm 23:1-6 aloud as a group. Let group members share observations. Try not to move into interpretation of the passage or application of what you read quite yet. Simply share what you observe.
 - · What do you see about God in verses 1-6?
 - · What do you notice about man in verses 1-6?
 - What is God's responsibility in verses 1-6, and what is man's responsibility?
 - · How would you summarize verses 1-6 in your own words?

Interpretation: What does the passage mean?

- 1. Read Exodus 3:14-15.
 - · What does it mean that God is "I AM?"
 - · How does God shepherd His people?
 - · What does it mean that the Lord is "MY shepherd?"
 - Why do God's people need God as their shepherd?
- 2. Read Deuteronomy 2:7, Exodus 15:13, Genesis 2:15, Deuteronomy 12:9-10, and Psalm 78:52-54. What do the passage and its context convey about God?
 - · What does it mean to "lack nothing?"
 - How does having God as shepherd ensure that God's people will "lack nothing?"
 - · How does God's steadfast love for the people He has redeemed guide us, by His strength, to His holy abode?
 - How and why does God give His people provision and rest?
- Read Mark 6:31, Mark 6:34, Mark 6:39-43, John 10:10-11, John 10:27 and Revelation 7:17.
 - · How is Jesus our Shepherd?
 - · How does Jesus provide for us?



- How do you feel Jesus protecting and providing for you personally?
- 4. Read Psalm 119:162 and Psalm 19:7-11.
 - · Why is God's Word worthy of our joy and how does He show you mercy?
 - · How is God's Word good and "sweeter also than honey and drippings of the honeycomb?"

Application: How can we apply this passage to our lives?

- 1. The Lord is my shepherd
 - · How diligently are you following the Great I AM?
 - How does it feel when you know that you are truly following the Lord?
 - · Where might you rely on yourself or others, rather than on the Lord?
 - How can your Church Group help you to rely more fully on the Lord?
- 2. God's is my provider and guide
 - · As you look at your life right now, what do you lack?
 - · In what concrete ways do you see God providing for you?
 - · How do you feel God guiding you toward heaven?
 - How can your Church Group pray for your needs?
- 3. God's rod and staff guide me to protection and to rest
 - · How do you feel God's protection over you?
 - How is God pulling (urging) you toward "green pastures and still waters?"
 - · Where might you be getting caught up in the 'busy-ness' of the world, and missing the goodness of God?
 - · How can your Church Group support you to focus more on God than on the world?
- 4. God's Word is my portion
 - · How does your life demonstrate your love for God's Word?
 - How do you see the goodness of God in His Word?
 - How can you be more diligent with your time in God's Word?
 - · How can your Church Group pray for your spiritual growth in the coming days?
