BIG IDEA

In a low-trust world, most people are not waiting for a polished presentation. They are waiting for someone who will notice them, listen well, ask good questions, extend real hospitality, and help them take one step closer to Jesus.

FRAMEWORK

Reach One is not about turning people into projects. **Reach One is about getting to know people and helping people get to know Jesus.**

This is not about pressure. It is about presence. This is not about forcing conversations. It is about noticing where God may already be opening one.

Evangelism can feel too big, too important, and too overwhelming. So we are going to break it down into three simple, concrete steps:

- ① COFFEE
- ② DINNER
- ③ GOSPEL

Jesus on the Road to Emmaus

Coffee, Dinner, Gospel is not just a method. It reflects the way of Jesus.

Watch the movements of Jesus:

- Jesus comes near
- Jesus asks questions
- Jesus listens
- Jesus opens the Scriptures
- Jesus is recognized at the table

Main Takeaway

Jesus often works through the ordinary rhythm of:

- Walking with people
- Listening to their story
- Opening the Scriptures
- Sharing a table

COFFEE = INTERESTS

Question: What's going on in this person's life?

Goal: Build trust, find common ground, listen well.

Focus: Interests, everyday life, rhythms, story, work, family



Helpful Questions:

- What has life been like for you lately?
- How did you end up here?
- What has been keeping you busy in this season?
- What do you enjoy doing when life slows down?

Remember :

- Ask open questions
- Listen more than you speak
- Avoid rushing depth
- Be genuinely curious
